Who is responsible?

Camden Safeguarding Children Board... ...is generally responsible for the safety and welfare of children and young people in Camden. But we cannot do this on our own — safeguarding children is everyone's responsibility.

How can you safeguard children?

Everyone wants to help to keep children safe... ...but often they don't know what to do or who to contact. This leaflet contains useful information on what you can do and who to contact if you are concerned about children's safety.

Safe from accidental injury or death

Built-up areas like Camden can be unsafe for children, especially busy roads. Camden is committed to making roads safer for children by educating them on the dangers, and trying to reduce traffic speed.

If you are worried that roads in your neighbourhood are not safe for children...

You can call the **Public Safety Team** on **020 7974 5619** to report any safety risk.

Many accidents happen at home, and Camden's Safe as Houses project can help parents to keep their children safe by providing advice on safety equipment.

If you would like advice on making your home safe for your child...

You can call Safe as Houses on 020 7561 4970.

What is safeguarding?

Safeguarding is about keeping children safe by:

- protecting them from harm
- supporting their health and development
- making sure they grow up in a safe environment.

Safeguarding is about knowing when a child is at risk or needs help to deal with problems so that they can be kept safe from:

- accidental injury or death
- bullying and harassment
- crime and anti-social behaviour
- neglect, abuse or violence in the home.

Safe from bullying or harassment

Bullying and harassment can make a child's life miserable, and disabled children are particularly vulnerable to bullying. Camden does not tolerate either bullying or harassment, and racial harassment is a hate crime. Camden has introduced several measures to help stop bullying and harassment at school and in the community.

If you think a child is being bullied...

You can contact the school, youth club, or play scheme involved. Children can contact Camden's free helpline on **0800 731 5801** for advice and support.

If you think a child is being harassed...

You can contact the **Anti-Social Behaviour Team** on **020 7974 3461**. To report incidents of racial harassment, contact the **Police Community Safety Unit** on **020 8733 5665/6474/5940/6441/6445**.

Safe from anti-social behaviour and crime

Children have a right to live in a safe environment, free from the threat of crime or anti-social behaviour. Equally, Camden is committed to reducing anti-social or criminal behaviour by children and young people.

If a child you know is a victim of crime...

You can call Victim Support on 020 7388 9550.

If you are worried a child is living with domestic violence...

You can call **Camden Safety Net** on **020 7974 3665**, or the **Police Community Safety Unit** on the numbers listed above.

If you think your area is unsafe for children because of street drinking, drugs or any other reason...

You can call the **Anti-Social Behaviour Team** on **020 7974 3461**. If you live in Bloomsbury or Camden Town, you can also call the **Street Warden Service** on **020 7974 5195** or **020 7974 5192** if you live in Gospel Oak or Kentish Town. If you think a child is not going to school...

You can contact the **Education Welfare Service** on **020 7974 7162**.

If you are worried that a child you know is becoming involved in crime or anti-social behaviour...

You can call **Camden Community Safety Team** on 020 7974 2915, or the **Youth Offending Team's Early** Intervention Service on 020 7974 6181.

If you are worried about a young person using drugs or alcohol or are concerned that a young person may be affected by someone else's alcohol or drug use...

You can call **FWD (Forward) Drug and Alcohol Service for** Young People in Camden on 020 7974 4701 for advice.

Camden's Safer Neighbourhood Teams can also provide advice on making your neighbourhood safer for children. Contact numbers are listed at the end of this leaflet. However, if you see a child in IMMEDIATE DANGER you should call the police on 999.

Safe from abuse and neglect

Most children in Camden are well cared for and protected by their parents... ...but a small number suffer harm or neglect. We all have a duty to protect these children. Children can be harmed because of physical abuse or injury, emotional or sexual abuse or because of neglect.

If you are worried that a child is being harmed or neglected...

You can contact **Social Work Services** on **020 7974 6600** or **020 7974 4094** and talk to a social worker about your concerns. Out of office hours, you can contact the **Emergency Duty Team** on **020 7278 4444**. You may not be sure if it's the best thing to do, but your information could be an important step in stopping a child being harmed.

Information for parents

If you are a parent...

...and you would like advice on any problem you or your child may be facing, you can contact any of the above services or community support organisations for parents in Camden, such as Sure Start.

If you feel you are struggling to cope, and would like more support, you can contact Social Work Services and talk to a social worker. All parents have difficult times, and it's best to talk about problems and get help before the situation gets worse.

Our new Parenting Handbook, available on our website (**www.cscb.org.uk**), from libraries and other public places, can provide parents with information on what services are available in Camden, and who to get in touch with if you need help.

You can find contact details for support organisations for parents and children in Camden at the end of this leaflet.
