

What commitment is required to be part of TIPiC?

Schools will need to:	Schools will be provided with:
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Commit to developing a whole-school trauma informed approach – including reflections on school behaviour policy, help for vulnerable pupils, partnerships with parents and support for staff wellbeing. • Identify a time for senior leadership briefing and discussion before programme begins • Identify time for 6-hour whole school trauma awareness training (for teachers, non-teaching staff, including business support and site teams). • Complete the TIPiC Self-Assessment Audit of existing good practice and areas for development in relation to trauma informed practice in the school. • Identify a TIPiC Champions Group to drive work in the school (including senior leaders, teaching and support staff). • Work with the TIPiC team to identify priorities and plan areas for development over the 12 months following the training. • Work with the allocated TIPiC team member to embed trauma informed practice (TIP) in the school, supporting staff and responding effectively to trauma via relationships with pupils and families, e.g.: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Give TIPiC Champions Group members regular, allocated time throughout the year to meet for planning and review (at least one meeting per half term, plus additional planning time). ○ School development plan and staff professional development continue to include TIP. ○ Support staff to use TIP when considering learning and support needs of individual pupils. ○ Support for senior leaders in continuing emphasis on TIP. ○ Enable professionals working with the school to support social, emotional and mental health to meet together to support joint trauma-informed approaches (including the TIPiC practitioner, school EP and CAMHS in schools clinician). • Cooperate with evaluation (e.g. staff and pupil questionnaires, post-project audit, etc.). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Named TIPiC champion(s) from Camden Learning, Robson House, The Royal Free Hospital School, CAMHS and/or the EPS who will work with the school for a total of 11 sessions (3 hours each) over the course of the year. The nature of this follow up support will be bespoke for each school, dependent on the school's identified priorities. • Facilitated training and materials: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ 6-hour whole school TIPiC training. • Facilitated TIPiC Champions Group meetings once per half term. • Access to the TIPiC network meetings with other schools and partners, including further training and sharing success. • Access to TIPiC resources and materials.
