## You should report any of the following signs in any pupils you encounter:

- Any unexplained injuries, bruising or marks
- Fear, watchfulness, over anxiety to please
- Comments about sexual activity or inappropriate sexual knowledge or behaviour
- Unexpected reaction towards people(fear, wariness)
- Withdrawn, anxiousness, lacking in confidence/self esteem
- Unwillingness to communicate or repetitive nervous behaviour e.g. rocking/hair twisting
- Signs of neglect, such as unsuitable clothing, poor hygiene, extremely pale or fatigued
- Anything else that makes you feel uncertain

- Tell them you will have to pass the information on and to whom
- Don't ask them to repeat themselves
- Listen and don't prompt them
- Reassure them and tell them they have done the right thing by telling you
- Don't' start to investigate the matter yourself
- Take the student to the DSL (Contact details on the left of this leaflet)
