The PE and sport premium for primary schools is government funding put in place to help primary schools, and schools with primary age students improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

The main focus for the RFHCS 2022-23 <u>funding allocation of £10,945</u>. Post COVID the school consulted with Camden's Sports Development team and have a engaged a new coach for the RF Recreation Club sessions. The aims of the overall offer, particularly in terms of increasing the variety of sports, remains to increase participation in sport and games and support well-being through <u>accessibility for as many as possible across all areas of the school (given the percentage of our different cohorts who also have presenting medical need or challenge) Plans to increase the offer to pupils in The Thomas Group and within the Outreach Service had to be were enacted with the reopening of the RF Rec Club.</u>

The carry forward for 2022/23 is £20
